Dear Parents and Carers,

As the Autumn Term draws to a close it is time to start thinking ahead to our end of year Christmas festivities.

I am very pleased to say that our children and staff will, this year, be taking part in Springhill Hospice's Wear Your Woollies Day.

This will be held in school on Friday 18th December.

On that day we would like children to come to school wearing their favourite jumper – instead of their uniform - to create a real festive feel.

The Hospice also supports families and carers who are affected by this type of condition, helping them cope with the pressure and strains of illness, to coping with bereavement and helping them move forward.

Wear Your Woollies Day is a fun and festive way to make a real difference to local hospice care and it will add something special to our school festivities this year. It is something positive to look forward to for everyone this December.
